Academic Purpose

The academic visit to the Department of Forensic Medicine, AIIMS, New Delhi, was organised for M.Sc. Forensic Science students as part of their academic curriculum. The visit was intended to provide students with practical exposure to post-mortem examination procedures and to strengthen their understanding of forensic medicine through direct observation of professional practice.

Description

The School of Forensic Science, Galgotias University, organised an academic visit for 63 students of M.Sc. Forensic Science to the Department of Forensic Medicine, All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), New Delhi, on 12 December 2025. The visit was undertaken as part of the academic curriculum and was aimed at providing students with practical exposure to post-mortem examination and the application of forensic medicine in case investigation.

The central academic component of the visit was a demonstration of post-mortem examination. Through the demonstration, students were able to relate theoretical concepts studied in their forensic science courses with professional practices followed in a specialised medical and forensic setting. The exposure was particularly valuable for understanding the systematic nature of post-mortem examination and its relevance to forensic investigation.

The visit also provided an opportunity for students to observe the professional environment of a premier medical institution and to appreciate the role of forensic medicine in the documentation and interpretation of medico-legal findings. The practical exposure supported students in developing a better understanding of how observations made during post-mortem examination contribute to forensic interpretation.

The visit was conducted under the supervision of two faculty members accompanying the students. Attendance of the students was to be recorded at the venue. The visit was approved as an academic activity, with the accompanying faculty members identified as Dr. Anugya Agrawal and Dr. Neeharika Srivastava. No class substitution was required for the accompanying faculty members, as indicated in the approval document.

Overall, the AIIMS visit provided meaningful experiential learning to the M.Sc. Forensic Science students by connecting classroom-based theoretical knowledge with practical demonstration in forensic medicine. Such exposure contributes to the development of professional understanding, observational skills and appreciation of the medico-legal importance of post-mortem examination.

Learning Outcomes / Key Takeaways

1. Students gained practical exposure to the process and significance of post-mortem examination.
2. Students were able to relate theoretical concepts of forensic medicine with professional practice.
3. The visit enhanced students' understanding of medico-legal examination in forensic investigations.
4. Students observed the professional working environment of a specialised forensic medicine department.
5. The experiential learning activity strengthened students' observational and professional competencies.
