National Service Scheme (NSS) Special Camp ReportThe National Service Scheme (NSS) Special Camp was successfully organized from 23rd March to 29th March 2026 at Rilka, Gautam Buddha Nagar, under the motto “Not Me, But You.” The camp aimed to promote social responsibility, community service, health awareness, cleanliness, gender equality, and teamwork among volunteers while strengthening the bond between students and the local community.During the seven-day camp, various educational, awareness, and social welfare activities were conducted. On the first day, volunteers visited the village to identify social and health-related issues such as domestic violence, superstition, poor sanitation, and common diseases.

The second day focused on spreading awareness regarding diabetes, hypertension, jaundice, and preventive healthcare practices through household visits and interactive discussions with villagers.The third day was dedicated to women sensitization and gender equality, where volunteers discussed women empowerment, equal responsibilities of men and women, and the importance of

respect and safety for women in society. On the fourth day, volunteers organized a cleanliness drive at the temple premises and performed a street play to spread awareness about social responsibility and positive change in society. The fifth day emphasized personal hygiene, menstrual hygiene, and hand hygiene awareness. Sanitary pads were distributed among women and adolescent girls, and they were educated regarding proper menstrual hygiene practices.

On the sixth day, a blood donation awareness program and free health testing camp were organized, including HIV screening and basic health check-ups, encouraging villagers to participate in health-promoting activities. The final day concluded with a cultural program, interaction with villagers, and discussions about the awareness activities conducted during the camp.
